Chief Master Sergeant (USAF retired) David Hill Former Command Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Intelligence Agency

Chief Master Sergeant (Retired) David Hill was Command Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Intelligence Agency (AIA), Kelly AFB, Texas, from December 1995 until his retirement from the USAF on 1 February 2001. A career admin specialist, he served in a wide variety of positions within the administration field, including the staffs of 3 major commands and AIA Prior to being selected as the AIA Command Chief, he served as Senior Enlisted Advisor, 67th Intelligence Wing, Kelly AFB, Texas. In the AIA Command Chief position, Chief Hill provided direct feedback to the AIA commander on all issues affecting welfare, readiness and morale of the AIA enlisted force. He served under the direction of 5 different AIA Commanders for 5-years during his tenure as AIA Command Chief Master Sergeant. Chief Hill is currently a civilian employee with the USAF, serving as Flight Commander, Cyber Operations Training, 24th Air Force, 67th Network Warfare Wing, 26th Operations Support Squadron, Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland TX.

Mr. Clemmons is currently serving as a Program Analyst for the 90th Information Operations Squadron, Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland TX.
